A Platinum Sponsorship is \$7500 and the sponsor receives two foursomes, their name (or company name) on the event banner, and a sign at a hole.

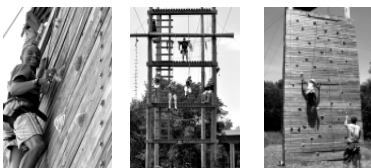
A Gold Sponsorship is \$5500, and differs from the Platinum Sponsor by one less foursome.
